



Life Group Questions

Resurrection: All or Nothing (1 Cor 15:35-58)

Instructions: A life group is a spiritual family. It is a time of mutual discussion, invitation, and growth together alongside the Holy Spirit. It's good to begin with prayer and 1-2 ice breaker questions to prime the pump and get to know one another. Then, after reading the Scriptures, **pick the questions that are of most interest to your group**. Make sure to conclude with a couple of application questions to live out our mission together. Finish with some time to care for one another and pray together.

Opening Question (pick 1-2 questions)

1. In your understanding, what happens after death for the Christian?
2. Should Christians be concerned about the environment, justice issues, nuclear proliferation, etc.? In other words, does it really matter how Christians live in the here and now? Explain.
3. What are you thankful for? Is there a challenge you are facing right now?
4. What is one thought or idea from Sunday's message that especially intrigued, provoked, disturbed, challenged, encouraged, warmed, warned, helped, or surprised you?

Read 1 Corinthians 15:35-58

1. Have someone summarize this passage in their own words.
2. What stands out or interests you in this passage?
3. Does anything in this passage challenge your previous understanding of what resurrection means for today?
4. What do you learn in this passage about the goodness of the world as it is now, before Christ returns?
5. Contrast how the world and people are like seeds now vs. how they will be in the resurrection when their potential is fulfilled.
6. What do you learn about God in this passage? (his character, his ways, etc.)
7. What do you learn about people in this passage?

Application

1. Read 1 Corinthians 15:58. What is the motivation to live out this passage?
2. How can you specifically live out this passage in the next few days? (Create an 'I Will...' statement)
3. How can you bless someone else as a result of this Scripture and discussion?
4. How can our group bless someone in response to this Scripture and discussion?
