# **Retro Discussion Questions (10-1-23)**

## Week 4 - What is Community?

Instructions: A life group is a family growing in Jesus together (worship), caring for each other (community), and BLESSing our neighbors together (mission). Start with a couple of the CONNECT questions. Then read the Scriptures and discuss. Make sure to conclude by applying the passage and finishing with a time of prayer.

#### **CONNECT Questions** (choose 1-2)

- 1. What is something you are thankful for this week?
- 2. From Sunday's message, is there a thought or idea that especially intrigued, provoked, disturbed, challenged, encouraged, or surprised you?
- 3. Are you facing a challenge right now?
- 4. Share a story where you see Jesus at work in the world around you and how you've been able to join him. Remember, God works through small stories.

### Look through the One Another passages on page 2 (also in "Sermon resources" at avalonchurch.org)

- 1. Which passage(s) most resonate with you? Explain.
- 2. Which passage(s) are hardest to live out? Explain.
- 3. In your opinion, what does healthy community look like in a small church or life group? Does that happen in your group?
- 4. How does **COMMUNITY** flow from and lead to **WORSHIP** and **MISSION**. In other words, how are they related?
- 5. What is the difference between community and What do you learn about people in this passage? (yourself, others)
- 6. What do you learn about God in this passage? (his character, his ways, etc.)

- 1. Pastor Don shared that sharing in communion together or having someone share their story each week are great ways to foster community. Is this something you are willing to do?
- 2. What are some other ways you can live out **COMMUNITY** in your life group?
