

Discussion Questions

Anointing: Never Suffer Alone

Instructions: A life group is a spiritual family. It is a time of mutual discussion, invitation, and growth together alongside the Holy Spirit. It's good to begin with prayer and 1-2 ice breaker questions to prime the pump and get to know one another. Then, after reading the Scriptures, <u>pick the questions that are</u> <u>of most interest to your group</u>. Make sure to conclude with a couple of application questions to live out our mission together. Finish with some time to care for one another and pray together.

Ice Breaker Question (pick 1-2 questions)

- 1. During long seasons of doubt or suffering, what kinds of things have others done that were not quite what you needed What things were done that really ministered to you?
- 2. Why do you think people are so quick to try to "fix" the unfixable things that cause suffering rather than just walking with people through the long journey ?
- 3. Is there a challenge you are facing right now?
- 4. What is one thought or idea from Sunday's message that especially intrigued, provoked, disturbed, challenged, encouraged, warmed, warned, helped, or surprised you?

Read and discuss James 5:13-16

- 1. Have someone summarize this passage in their own words.
- 2. What things jump out to you in this passage?
- 3. What kinds of things does this passage say about walking together through suffering and sickness?
- 4. Anointing with oil was a common first century practice when someone was sick. But James invites the community into this practice (vs.14). What meaning and benefit is added when the church-family participates in the healing process?
- 5. What does it look like in our lives to walk the long process of just "being with" someone who is struggling?
- 6. What do you learn about God in this passage?
- 7. What do you learn about people in this passage?

Application

- 1. How can you specifically live out this passage in the next few days? (Have each person create an 'I Will...' statement)
- 2. Is there someone you are inviting to Easter? Who?
- 3. How can you bless someone else as a result of this Scripture and discussion?
- 4. How can our group bless someone in response to this Scripture and discussion?
- 5. Read Revelation 21:3-4 that describes our future hope.
