

Discussion Questions

A Beautiful Mess (1 Corinthians 3:9-23) Jan.2, 2022

Instructions: A life group is a spiritual family. It is a time of mutual discussion, invitation, and growth together alongside the Holy Spirit. It's good to begin with prayer and 1-2 ice breaker questions to prime the pump and get to know one another. Then, after reading the Scriptures, <u>pick the questions that are of most interest to your group</u>. Make sure to conclude with a couple of application questions to live out our mission together. Finish with some time to care for one another and pray together.

Ice Breaker Question (pick 1-2 questions)

- 1. Describe a belief or action that you have seen divide churches or Christians? Have any of these divided you from a church or other Christian? Explain.
- 2. What is a challenge you are facing?
- 3. What is one thought or idea from Sunday's message that especially intrigued, provoked, disturbed, challenged, encouraged, warmed, warned, helped, or surprised you?

Read and discuss 1 Corinthians 3:9-23

- 1. Have someone retell this passage in their own words.
- 2. How does this passage relate to the Church in Orlando, FL in 2022?
- 3. (from vss 5-6) Who are the Paul's and Apollos' who God has used in your life. How did they shape your faith (for good and bad)?
- 4. Who have you been a Paul or Apollos to?
- 5. (vss 10-13) What foundations other than Christ can the church be built on? What have you witnessed?
- 6. How do you think Paul expects people to keep unity even when they disagree? What issues in today's world do you think that is hardest?
- 7. What in the church do you think will last forever and what will be burned up? (vss 12-15)

Application

- 1. In what ways are you more mature as a follower of Christ than you were a year ago?
- 2. How do you think God is growing you in maturity now?
- 3. How can you specifically live out this passage in the next few days? (Everyone creates an 'I Will' statement)
- 4. How can you bless someone else as a result of this Scripture and discussion?
- 5. How can we as a group bless someone in response to this passage?
